Lam has expressed "full support" for the pro-
democracy movement that has rocked
Hong Kong for more than a month,
triggering huge protests that have plunged
the city into chaos. Violence has erupted on
Hong Kong's streets since protests broke
out on June 9. Crowds have fought running
battles with riot police in several
neighbourhoods, forcing shops to close and
offices to shut their gates. Since a new
protest law was introduced on Tuesday,
students have stayed away from classes as
police arrest demonstrators and force riot
police to respond with tear gas and rubber
bullets. The authorities have taken a hard
line against the protests as they risk a
repeat of the chaos of last summer, when
the city was hit by months of unrest that
ultimately saw multiple large-scale
demonstrations. Ms Lam, the city's second
chief executive in as many months, has
been silent about the protests, but has sent
strong signals of support through her
actions. She has urged fellow party

In a press conference on Wednesday afternoon, she said: "The (protest) ordinance provides a very important tool for law enforcement to enforce legislation under the Law Society Ordinance. "As a matter of principle, I agree fully with the sentiment of the chief executive on the issue." She later said she was fully supportive of police efforts in "calmly and effectively" enforcing the law. "We have to respect the rule of law," she said.

Ms Lam also said the Hong Kong government would fully apply the law and "respect the public's freedom of speech and assembly as guaranteed by the Basic Law". She said her conscience would not allow her to interfere in
